FREDERICK DOUGLASS MEMORIAL AND HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION ("FDMHA") ESSAY SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST

Even after 200 hundred years, Mr. Douglass words have meaning and impact in current social justice and political arenas. Mr. Douglass is one of the most important figures in the abolitionist movement and a highly respected 19th century statesman. His rise from slavery to becoming a counselor to President Abraham Lincoln continues to inspire generations. Our essay contest is designed to inspire you to help us keep the legacy of Frederick Douglass relevant and thriving

The winner of the competitive annual contest is awarded a \$3,000 prize. A second-place winner receives \$2,000 and a third-place winner receives \$1,000.

What to Write

Contestants are asked to a script and imaginary conversation between Frederick Douglass, the abolitionist in 1860, and Frederick Douglass, the congressional candidate in 2020. The script must offer evidence of Frederick Douglass' life and how his work as an abolitionist can inspire public servants in 2020.

The contestant must submit a writing that demonstrates research on the life and contributions of Mr. Douglass. The document must have at least five facts of Mr. Douglass's life and references to at least two of his speeches or writings within the script and relate the writing to a conversation between the abolitionist Douglass and a contemporary 2020 congressional candidate Douglass.

Who is Eligible

- Senior high school students attending public schools in Washington DC, or in the State of Maryland or the Commonwealth of Virginia, within a 50-mile radius of the District of Columbia.
- Students must be enrolled in college in the fall semester of 2020 or the spring semester of 2021.

Requirements

- Entries due by 11:59 p.m. on April 10, 2020.
- Do not include name or other personal information on essay.
- Essays can be no more than 1000 words but must be a minimum of 750 words. Citations and bibliography are not included in the word count.
- Essays must be the original work of the contestant.
- Essays must have a minimum of one source that is **NOT Wikipedia**, **magazines**, **newspapers**, **or blogs**.
- Essays must include endnotes, footnotes, or a bibliography (not included in word count).

Essay Submission

• Submit entries via email or first-class mail with registration form. Essays sent by mail must be postmarked April 10, 2020. Emailed essays must show a sent date by no later than 11:59 p.m. on April 10, 2020.
